The laptop program in grades 5 - 8 is off to a great start. Grades 5 and 6 are learning about their laptops and flash drives - how to care for them and how to use them. They have also begun learning how to use Microsoft Word 2007.

Grades 7 and 8 went through a review of these same skills, and have finished a six-panel brochure with graphics and specifics on margins, fonts, and style. Both classes are now working on Excel worksheets that require formatting of cells. The next step will be using formulas to format cells. Grade 7 will then move on to creating a booklet, while Grade 8 will start working on a database.

While these skills can be taught in the confines of a computer lab, having a laptop for daily use makes it possible for students to accelerate their learning in preparation for the demands of high school and college. 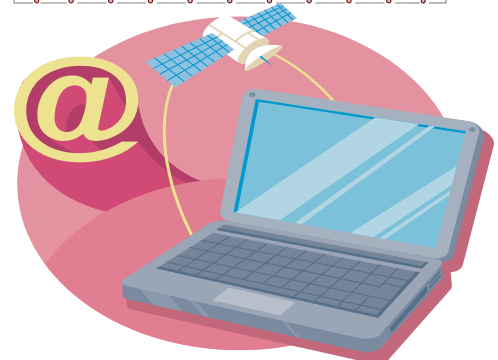

September 29th - October 10th



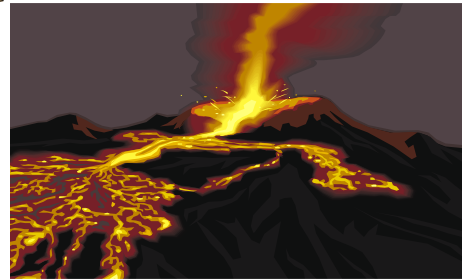
